

Who can Vote

You can vote if you are:

- a) Canadian citizen;
- b) 18 years of age or older
- c) resident of British Columbia for at least 6 months immediately preceding voting day;
- d) resident of OR registered owner of real property within the **North Cariboo Recreation and Parks Service Area** for at least 30 days immediately preceding voting day; and
- e) not otherwise disqualified by law from voting.

If you live in the North Cariboo Recreation and Parks Service Area but don't own property, you can vote. If you own property in the jurisdiction, but live elsewhere you can vote as a non-resident property elector, but there are additional documentation requirements and these voters are strongly advised to contact the CRD (Alice Johnston or Darron Campbell) before voting day so that we can inform them. One vote per property as a non-resident property elector.

There is no limit on how many people per household can vote as resident property electors, provided they meet the criteria above.

In order to vote you MUST bring:

Two pieces of ID

- One piece must show your signature
- One piece must show your residency

Note: If you do not have ID that shows your residency, you may sign a declaration stating your residency.

Mail ballot voting is available for those who will be away on all voting opportunities or who are physically unable to attend a voting station. You can request a mail ballot by phoning the Chief or Deputy Chief Election Officer starting on Oct. 10 until 4 p.m. on Nov. 7. A mail ballot package will be sent to you and you are able to drop off or mail it back. It must be received no later than 8 p.m. on Nov. 9, 2013 to be counted.
